- 3. Please address only the Mayor and not members of the public, staff, or presenters.
- 4. Please abide by any time limits. Time limits will be used to ensure everyone is heard and that there is sufficient time for the Council to complete their agenda within a reasonable timeframe.
- 5. The Mayor will make a reasonable effort to allow everyone to speak once before speakers address the Council a second time per the limited 2 minute timeline adopted on January 23, 2017.
- 6. Once public comment has been heard, discussion will be limited to the City Council members.
- 7. Please do not interrupt or mock other speakers or otherwise exhibit disruptive behavior during the City Council meeting.
- 8. Please do not repeat the points made by others, except to indicate agreement or disagreement with other views.
- 9. Please use the hallway for side conversations. It is difficult to hear speaker remarks when side conversations are occurring in the Council Chamber.
- 10. Presentations to the Council are not open to public comment. However, per the policy adopted on December 21, 2015, matters on the agenda requiring a vote are open to public comment immediately prior to the Council vote.

# **Preliminary Water/Sewer Calculations**

This is not a recommendation by the Treasurer's office but an option for the City Council and the City Manager's office to consider. As mentioned at the last council meeting, increasing the fixed rates was one of the options to explore. I have averaged the losses over the last five years in both the Water and Sewer Funds. The Sewer Fund had an average loss of \$377,802 per year or \$94,450 per quarter. The Water Fund had an average loss of \$43,100 per year or \$10,775 per quarter. The average loss for sewer and water combined is \$420,902 per year or \$105,225 per quarter.

In the Water Fund raising the fixed rates by 6% would increase revenue approx. \$5,275 per quarter or \$21,100 per year.

Raising the water metered rates by 5% (2.15 – 2.25 & 3.15 – 3.31) would increase revenue Approx. \$5,423 for a total water fund increase of approx. \$10,698 per quarter or \$42,792 per year.

In the Sewer Fund raising the fixed rates by 53% would increase the revenue \$68,567 per quarter or \$274,268 per year.

Raising the sewer metered rates by 15% (3.60 – 4.14 & 5.25 – 6.03) would increase revenue approx. \$25,226 per quarter or \$100,904 per year. The total increase in revenue for the sewer fund would be approx. \$375,172 per year.

The total increase for sewer and water will be approx. \$417,964.

This option would get the funds to approx. the break-even point at the current time. The metered rates would have to increase again at some point to provide revenue for the new water tower principal and Interest and future operational costs increases.

It is my pleasure on behalf of the City Council to offer you the position of Fire Chief of the City of Newport beginning on March 12, 2024 under the following terms and conditions.

<u>Duties</u>. As Fire Chief you shall have primary responsibility for overseeing and directing the operations of the City's Fire Department, including the City's emergency rescue operations under the direction and supervision of the City Manager and in accordance with Vermont law, the City Charter and as set forth in the Fire Chief job description, which may from time to time be amended by the City Council, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, as well as such other duties and responsibilities as the Council from time to time may assign. As Fire Chief you may also be nominated to be the local Health Officer and carry out the statutory and regulatory duties pursuant to Title 18, Chapter 11 of Vermont Statutes Annotated.

# Salary and Benefits.

- A. Fire Chief will be paid an annual base salary of not less than \$70,000 per year to be paid in installments at the same time that other non-union employees of the City are paid.
- B. If nominated by the City Council and he receives a certificate of appointment from the Vermont Commissioner of Health, the Fire Chief will be paid an annual base salary of not less than \$5,000 per year in addition to the Fire Chief salary. The Health Officer salary to be paid in instalments at the same time that other non-union employees of the City are paid.
- C. Fire Chief will receive cost of living wage increases when issued to non-union City staff.
- D. <u>Benefits</u>. Fire Chief will receive benefits as provided in the Personnel Policy and as described in Addendum C which may change from time to time.
- E. <u>Vacation Leave</u>: Fire Chief shall be entitled to two weeks of annual vacation leave, totaling ten business days of vacation time. Upon termination of employment, the City shall compensate Fire Chief for all accrued but unused vacation time in accordance with the Personnel Policy which may change from time to time.
- F. <u>Sick Leave</u>: Fire Chief shall be entitled to accrue and use sick leave consistent with the personnel policy, which may change from time to time, applicable to Department Heads.
- G. Retirement: Fire Chief shall participate in the VMERS C retirement system. The City shall contribute said retirement account in the same percentage amount as it does for non-union City employees. All retirement savings policies and rules shall apply in the same manner as they do for non-union employees.

## Expenses.

A. <u>Moving Expense</u>: The City shall make a one time payment of \$5,000 to the Fire Chief to be paid within 30 days after the Fire Chief moves his residency in compliance with the residency requirement of this Agreement.

- B. <u>Mobile Phone</u>. Fire Chief shall be provided with mobile phone which shall remain the property of the City and which shall be used primarily for City business purposes.
- C. <u>Automobile</u>. Fire Chief has available for their use an automobile provided by and maintained by the City.
- D. <u>Professional Development</u>. The City may approve and pay for reasonable expenses for training, licensing, and other professional development, subject to the necessary appropriation of funds within the annual budget and prior authorization by the City Council.
- E. <u>Other Expenses</u>. Fire Chief shall be reimbursed for any other reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, including for overnight travel (according to GSA per diem, up to the budgeted amount) with prior approval from the Council.

## Hours of Work.

- A. Fire Chief is an exempt position under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). Fire Chief may be expected to work more than 40 hours per week in a workweek.
- B. Fire Chief may establish a regular 40 hour per week schedule, Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. with approval from the City Council and may adjust their work schedule as necessary to accommodate the operational needs of the department.
- C. Fire Chief shall keep the City Council and City Manager apprised of changes to their work schedule.

# Residency.

Fire Chief shall reside within the limits of the City of Newport.

# Ratification

Linda Joy Sullivan

This Agreement is subject to, and shall not become effective until, a vote of ratification by the City Council, which vote shall not take place prior to the Fire Chief's execution of this Agreement.
